Guidelines for clothing on Wacky Tacky Day

Students may wear a mismatched, clashing, crazy outfit. They must wear athletic shoes and socks, but socks don't have to be uniform. No sleeveless shirts or tank tops unless layered over a shirt with sleeves. Clothing should be properly fitting, not torn, and an appropriate length—hems must be past the fingertips. **No shorts please.** Hats are ok, but will be removed during class time as determined by the teacher.

Pi Day guidelines

Pajama Day is an optional activity that is great fun! If your child wants to participate, they must wear pj's that have full long pants and a top with short or long sleeves. They'll need to be warm. Flannel pants and a t-shirt are great if you don't have a matching set! Sweats do not count as pajamas. Students must wear regular school shoes and socks. If pj's are loose, a tank or t-shirt underneath would be perfect. Students who participate should come to school in their pj's. They'll wear them all day.

Swimming Guidelines:

Girls will be required to wear one-piece suits, two piece suites with long tops that cover the tummy, or a t-shirt over a twopiece. Because of chlorine in the pool, the YMCA allows swim shirts or white cotton t-shirts.

Only coast guard approved life jackets may be used as personal floatation devices. Students wearing life jackets are not permitted on the Big Blue Slide. Students wishing to swim on the deep side of the pool must pass a swim test. Goggles are optional.

Please pack swimwear and a towel in a bag (not the bookbag) your child can take to the YMCA. A comb or brush is optional.

Team Shirt Day guidelines

Students may replace their uniform shirt with one representing a team they like—youth, local, college, or professional. T-shirts, jerseys, sweatshirts, warm ups, and shooter shirts are all acceptable, including the t-shirts students may have from St. Mary's Field Day. Sleeveless or tanks may be worn if layered over another shirt with sleeves. The rest of their clothing is school uniform. Only the shirt may be switched out. Tuition Scholarships for next year

The Invest in Kids Act (8/31/17) allows income tax credits for authorized contributions to Scholarship Granting Organizations. These SGO's then provide scholarships for eligible Illinois students to attend private or parochial schools in Illinois.

3 Things to Know:

- 1) St. Mary's (and all Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Springfield) is an eligible school.
- 2) Families can begin applying 1/31/18 at empowerillinois.org. To be considered K-12 students must come from a household with income below 300 percent of the federal poverty level (\$73,800 for a family of four.) St. Mary's families who meet these requirements must apply to Empower Illinois before being considered for our own CAPE tuition assistance awards.
- 3) Donations are divided among 5 regions in the state. The amount of funding each region receives is based on population and the total funds donated statewide. So far our region 5 has received \$32,000 in contributions. That won't go far.

I'll keep you informed as things are changing almost daily in this program!

7th& 8th grade at St. Mary's

Thank you to all who responded to the interest survey sent out in November. There were many kind words shared and important issues raised. These have been attached for your review.

The survey was sent to parents of our current 3rd—6th graders which raised the question, "Why not ask everyone, including parishioners?" My reasoning: If we don't have the numbers and interest in the immediate future, then there is no point in further discussion. I have also attached a chart showing interest level among these current families. It is low for the next two years.

The chief concern of the Parish Finance Committee is cost. To hire one additional full-time teacher would cost a minimum of \$40,000 for salary and benefits. This would be an annual expense and would double if two grade levels were added. Textbooks and equipment for an additional classroom would run from \$6000 to as much as \$10,000 initially.

Another piece of this puzzle: Our enrollment by grade decreases as students get older. This is true of all Catholic schools in our diocese and other private schools. The larger enrollment numbers are in the younger grades. I've also attached those numbers for the last 10 years. You will see that St. Mary's has grown, but the each class loses students as they move through the school.

I'll bring this up for discussion at the Feb. 5 Booster Club Meeting.
